The proposed rule changes are attached to this order.

The Board further votes to authorize Director Cam Ward to sign the Notice of Intended Action form for the proposed rule changes, and the Board orders its Legal Department to complete the procedures required by Alabama Code § 15-22-37 and the Alabama Administrative Procedures Act.

Finally, the Board orders that the proposed rule changes and any amendments thereto be placed on the agency's website until the proposed rule changes become effective or are withdrawn.

**Proposed New Rule for Alabama Administrative Code r. 640-X-7-.03**

***To Be Added:***

(1) The agency shall issue a Certificate of Employability to individuals released on parole or mandatory supervised release who meet the eligibility criteria set forth below. The certificate recognizes the individual's efforts toward successful workforce reentry and their demonstrated ability to obtain and maintain employment.

(2) To qualify for a Certificate of Employability, an inmate must meet all of the following criteria:

(a) No violent disciplinary infractions during the current term of incarceration.

(b) No disciplinary infractions of any kind within the preceding 12 months of incarceration.

(c) While in custody of ADOC, successfully completed GED, higher education, or trade school.

(d) Have an ADOC custody level of Min-Community or Min-Out and the employment must be verified as current.

(3) The following individuals are not eligible to receive a Certificate of Employability:

(a) Any individual required to register as a sex offender pursuant to Code of Ala. 1975, Chapter 20A of Title 15.

(b) Any individual convicted of a violent offense as defined in Code of Ala. 1975, Section 12-25-32.

(4) When the agency provides notice of an inmate's parole eligibility date, the agency shall include information regarding the opportunity to obtain a Certificate of Employability and the criteria required for eligibility.

(5) Prior to the board's decision on parole, or release by the Alabama Department of Corrections to mandatory supervision, the agency shall conduct an Employability Review to determine whether the inmate meets the criteria for a Certificate of Employability.

**Proposed New Rule for Alabama Administrative Code r. 640-X-7-.03**

- (a) If parole is granted and all criteria are satisfied, the agency shall issue the Certificate of Employability, and the issuance shall be recorded in the board's minutes.
  - (b) When an inmate is within one week of the eligibility date for mandatory supervised release, as determined by the Alabama Department of Corrections, and all eligibility criteria are satisfied, the board shall be notified, and such notification shall be recorded in the board's minutes.
  - (c) The certificate shall be provided to the individual upon reporting to the assigned parole officer immediately following release.
  - (d) If the board rescinds a grant of parole prior to release, any determination to issue a Certificate of Employability shall be void.
  - (e) If an otherwise eligible inmate becomes ineligible prior to release—due to a disciplinary infraction, conviction of a new felony offense, or other disqualifying event—the Certificate of Employability shall be void.
- (6) Upon notification that a recipient of a Certificate of Employability has been convicted of a felony offense in any jurisdiction within the United States:
- (a) The board shall be notified; the Certificate of Employability shall be revoked and entered into the board's minutes.
  - (b) The agency shall update its records, including any public listing on its website, to reflect the revocation.

**Proposed New Rule for Alabama Administrative Code r. 640-X-9-.07**

***To Be Added:***

(1) Following revocation of parole or mandatory supervision, the person supervised may request reconsideration by the board.

(2) Persons seeking revocation reconsideration may only do so by submitting an ABPP-7 within either two months of:

(a) the board's order revoking supervision; or

(b) an acquittal, dismissal (with prejudice), or nolle prosequi (with prejudice and without conditions) of all criminal charges relied upon by the Board to revoke parole.

(3) Reconsideration requests submitted pursuant to section (2)(b) must include a copy of the relevant court order.

(4) Bureau staff will screen submitted applications for completeness before forwarding to the Legal Division for legal review. Staff may summarily reject incomplete or procedurally improper requests without obtaining legal review.

(5) At minimum, legal review will consist of determining:

(a) the lawfulness of the sanction imposed by the board,

(b) the revocation proceeding's compliance with due process requirements,

(c) whether clear and convincing evidence of innocence exists,

(d) whether the parole court record contains non-hearsay evidence supporting the hearing officer's findings, and

(e) whether the terms of the court order and circumstances of its issuance justify reconsideration for requests submitted pursuant to (2)(b) above.

(6) The Legal Division will forward appropriate requests passing legal review together with any recommendations to the board.

(7) The board may deny or grant reconsideration requests and, when granted, order any relief it deems appropriate.

**Proposed New Rule for Alabama Administrative Code r. 640-X-9-.07**

(8) Appropriate bureau staff will inform the requestor by mail of any procedural rejection or final merits decision made on the request.

(9) Nothing in this rule shall create a right, expectation, or liberty interest in having the revocation of supervision reconsidered by the board.

**ALABAMA BUREAU OF PARDONS AND PAROLES**

**INSTRUCTIONS ON APPLYING FOR REVOCATION RECONSIDERATION**

BEFORE COMPLETING THIS APPLICATION, READ AND REVIEW THE RULES IN ALABAMA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE R. 640-X-9-.07, WHICH CAN BE FOUND ON THE AGENCY'S WEBSITE (PAROLES.ALABAMA.GOV), AND THE INSTRUCTIONS BELOW.

- 1) All requests for reconsideration must be submitted on the Alabama Bureau of Pardons and Paroles's Application for Reconsidering Revocation of Supervised Release form (ABPP-7). The agency will not accept requests submitted any other way.
- 2) Fill out the form completely. If you do not recall the exact date of the revocation order, you may provide an approximate date. Incomplete applications will be rejected.  
State compelling reasons and, if applicable, provide documentary evidence justifying your reconsideration request. If additional space is needed, you may attach ten additional pages (not including any documentary evidence) to this application. The following are examples of reasons and evidence that do not warrant relief:
  - Arguments that witnesses lied at the parole court hearing.
  - Mitigation arguments regarding an applicant's good behavior while incarcerated or while previously under supervision.
  - Disagreement with a sanction imposed if within the board's discretion.
  - Disagreement with the hearing officer's factual findings where testimony or other evidence is contradictory.
- 3) If you wish for the board to consider any documentary evidence, you must attach a copy to, and submitted it with, the application. Describe, but do not attach, any non-documentary evidence (e.g., a video) in your possession that you can provide later if requested.
- 4) If seeking reconsideration based upon an acquittal, dismissal (with prejudice), or nolle prosequi (with prejudice and without conditions) of all criminal charges relied upon by the board in its revocation order, you must attach a copy of the order from the court that disposed of the charges. Charges dismissed as a result of a plea bargain in which you pled guilty to one or more reduced or different charges do not justify reconsideration.
- 5) Sign and date the application. Unsigned and/or undated applications will be rejected.

To receive consideration, applications must be postmarked *within two months* of:

- the date of the board order revoking parole or mandatory supervision; or
- the date of the court order of acquittal, dismissal (with prejudice), or nolle prosequi (with prejudice and without conditions).

Applications rejected for being incomplete, unsigned, missing required information, or failing to comply with the Board's administrative rules, may be resubmitted as a corrected application if postmarked within the applicable 2-month time period above.

## Proposed Amendment for Alabama Administrative Code r. 640-X-7-.02

### *To Be Amended:*

(1) An individual seeking a Certificate of Eligibility to Register to Vote (“CERV”) shall file an application on a form approved by the Agency agency (Form ABPP-4). All pardon procedures established by Rule 640-X-7-.01 shall generally apply to CERV except that a CERV shall be granted within forty-four (44) days to an applicant who meets all of the following requirements as verified by the Code of Ala. 1975, Section 15-22-36.1 investigation and reporting process:

(2) The person has lost his or her right to vote by reason of conviction in a state or federal court ~~in any case~~ except for a conviction for any of the following offenses: impeachment, murder, rape in any degree, sodomy in any degree, sexual abuse in any degree, incest, sexual torture, enticing a child to enter a vehicle for immoral purposes, soliciting a child by computer, production of obscene matter involving a minor, production of obscene matter, parents or guardians permitting children to engage in obscene matter, possession of obscene matter, possession with intent to distribute child pornography, or treason.

1. The person has no criminal felony charges pending against him or her in any state or federal court.

2. The person has paid all fines, court costs, fees, and victim restitution ordered by the sentencing court at the time of sentencing on disqualifying ~~eases-convictions~~.

3. Any of the following are true in the disqualifying convictions:

(a) The person has been released upon completion of sentence.

(b) The person has been pardoned.

(c) The person has successfully completed probation or parole and has been released from compliance by the ordering entity.

(3) Application for CERV shall not affect the right of any person to apply for a pardon with or without restoration of civil or political rights or remission of fine or forfeiture pursuant to Code of Ala. 1975, Section 15-22-36 or Rule 640-X-7-.01 of this Chapter.

## **Proposed Repeal of Alabama Administrative Code r. 640-X-1-.01**

### ***To Be Repealed:***

Act 2019-393, which became effective September 1, 2019, created the Director of Pardons and Paroles to serve as the chief executive officer of the Agency to perform all administrative duties as provided by law. Pursuant to this Act, the three-member Board retained decision-making authority to grant or deny pardons, paroles, restoration of political and civil rights, remission of fines and forfeitures, and to revoke parole. As chief executive officer, the Director holds appointing and supervisory authority of all Agency employees, subject to the provisions of the Merit System Act; responsibility for meeting all Agency fiscal and budgetary requirements; responsibility for developing and implementing all Agency policies and procedures; and responsibility for supporting the Board's decision-making function by promulgating rules necessary for the performance of Board duties as well as maintaining a record of all official Board actions. The Director is the custodian of the Agency's records, keeper of the Agency's seal, and responsible for maintaining the Agency's Administrative Code.

**Proposed New Rule for Alabama Administrative Code r. 640-X-1-.01**

***To Replace the Repealed Alabama Administrative Code r. 640-X-1-.01:***

(1) The Alabama Legislature created the Alabama Board of Pardons and Paroles, an agency with authority to make decisions concerning pardons, paroles, remissions, and restoration of civil and political rights and to supervise persons released to supervision in Alabama.

(2) The agency consists of:

(a) A three-member board granted certain exclusive decision-making authority and powers.

(b) A Director of Pardons and Paroles who serves as the chief executive officer of the agency and who is authorized to perform the administrative duties as provided by law.

(c) A division referred to as the Alabama Bureau of Pardons and Paroles under the authority of the director encompassing responsibilities of the agency, including administrative, supervisory, and operational activities, other than those reserved exclusively to the three-member board.

(3) The decision-making powers exclusive to the board include:

(a) The power to adopt rules, guidelines, or other policies.

(b) The power to grant or deny pardons, paroles, restoration of political and civil rights, and the remission of fines and forfeitures.

(c) The power to sanction persons paroled or released to mandatory supervision who violate conditions of their supervision.

(4) The authority and responsibilities of the director include:

(a) Appointing and supervising, subject to the provisions of the Merit System Act, all employees necessary to carry out the duties of the agency.

(b) Performing, on behalf of the agency, all fiscal and budgetary requirements imposed on the agency.

(c) Developing and implementing, on behalf of the board, all policies and

procedures related to individuals under the agency's supervision.

(d) Attending, in person or by designee, all board meetings, acting as the board's secretary, and maintaining a record of the board's official actions.

(e) Recommending and promulgating rules, guidelines, and other policies for the board's consideration as necessary for the effective and efficient performance of the agency's duties.

(f) The power to act as the custodian of the agency's records.

(g) The power to maintain the agency's Administrative Code.
