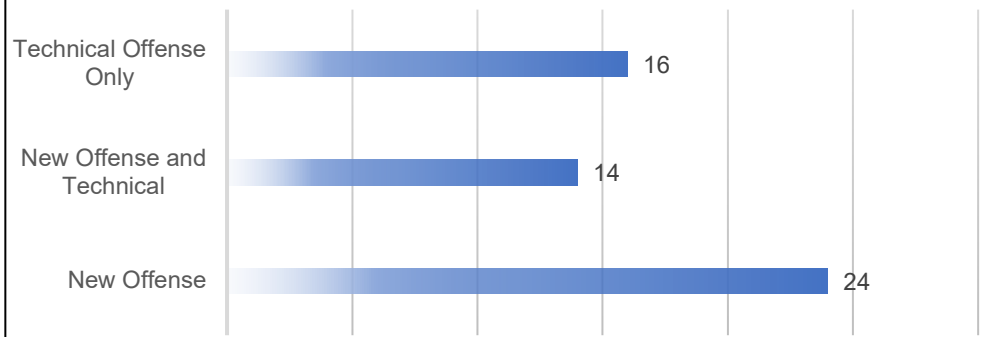

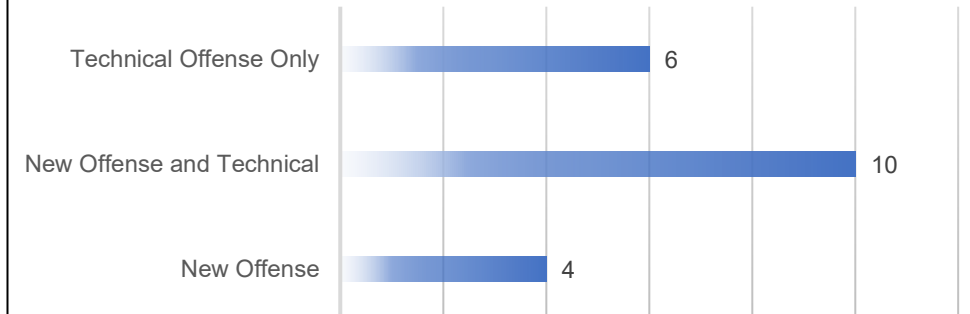

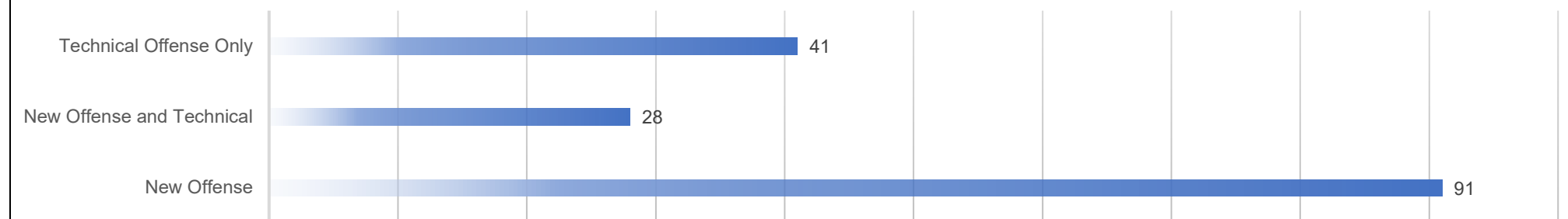

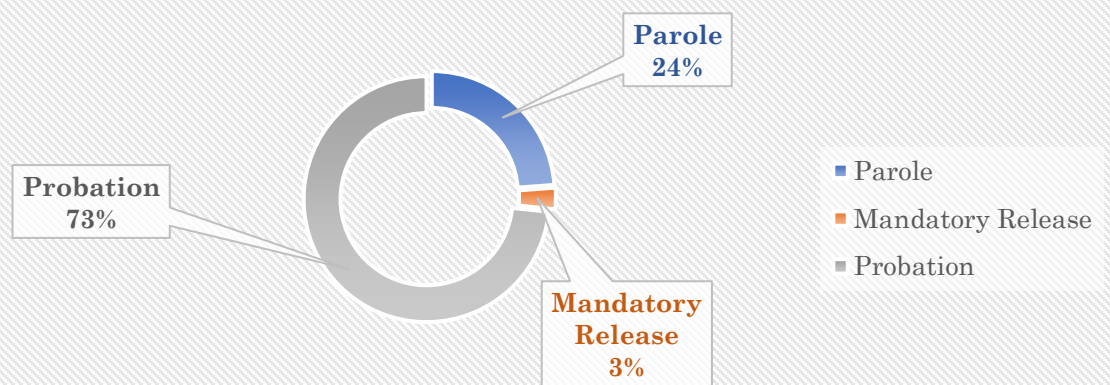

REVOCATIONS BY OFFENDER TYPE FY25

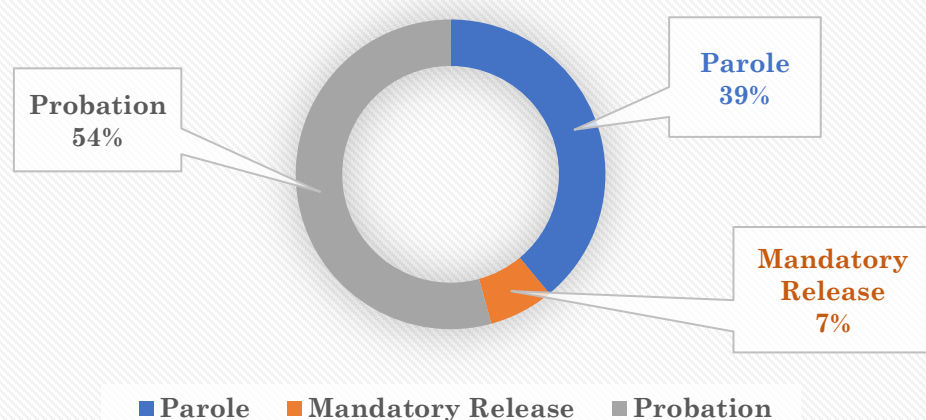

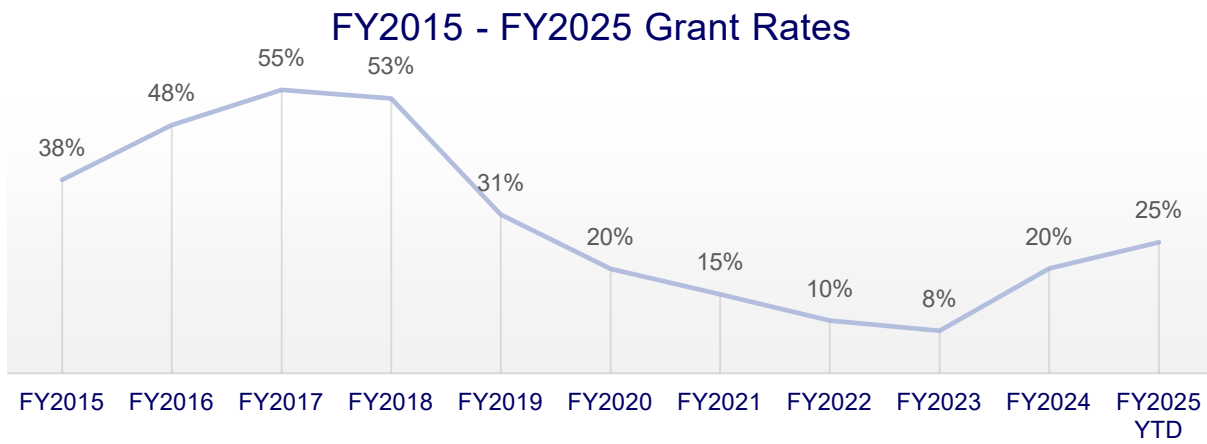

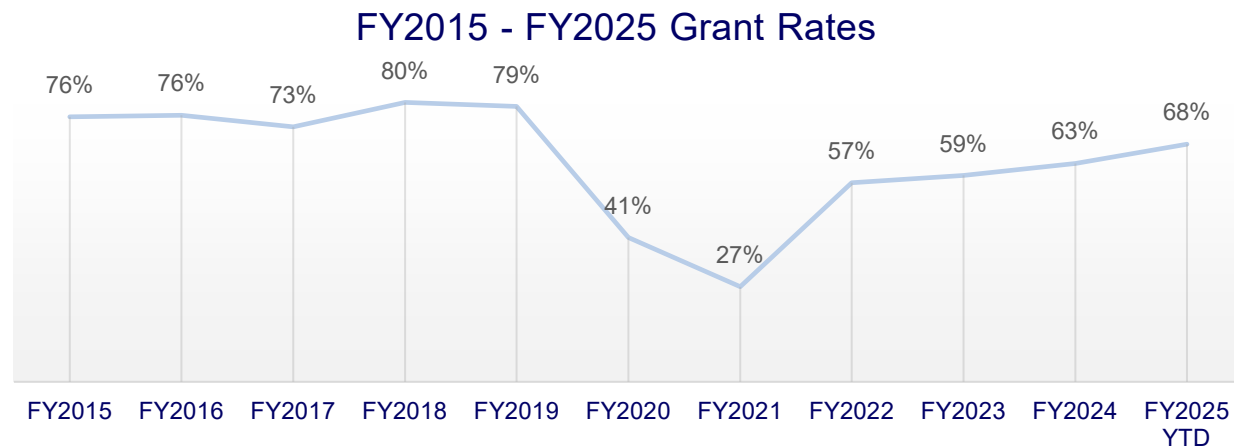

Board Action Yearly Trends-Parole



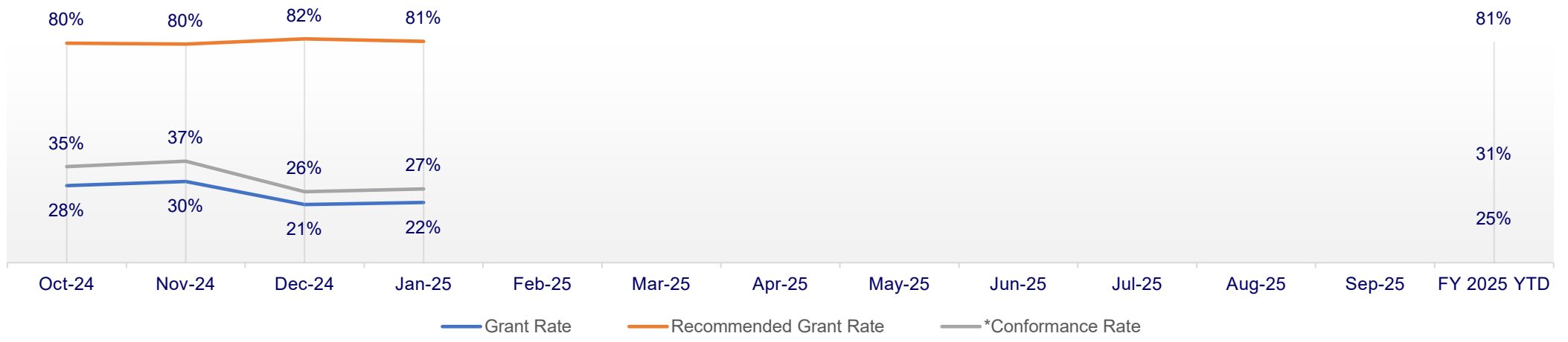

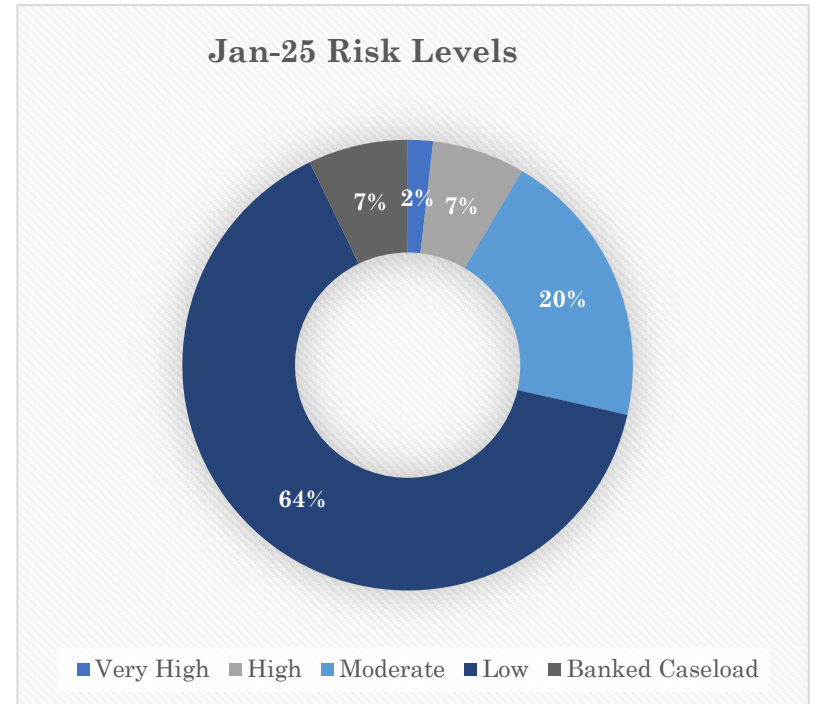
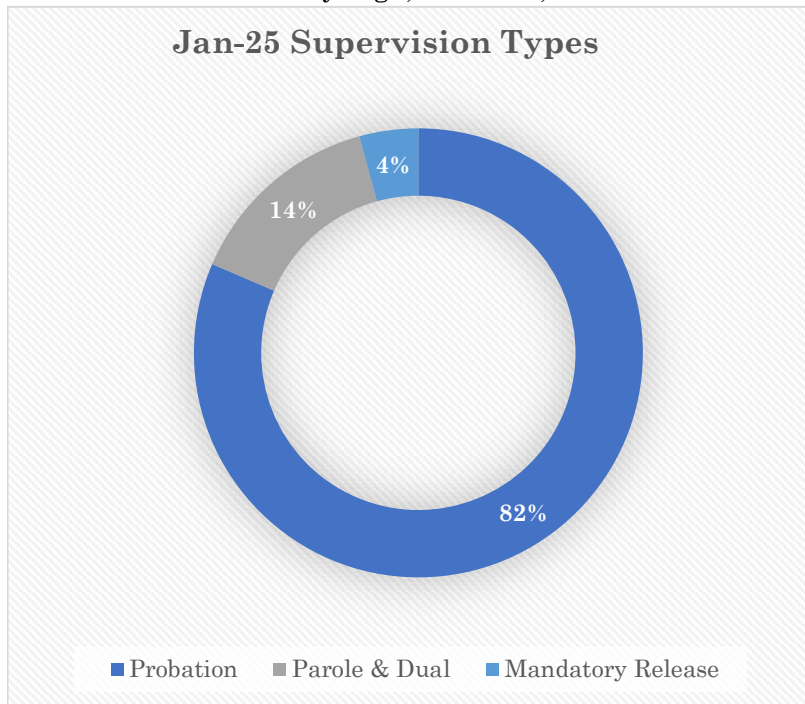
