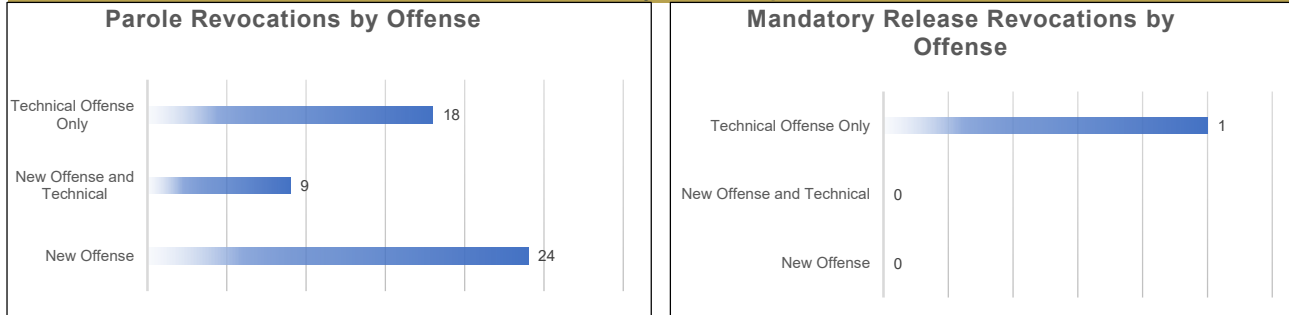

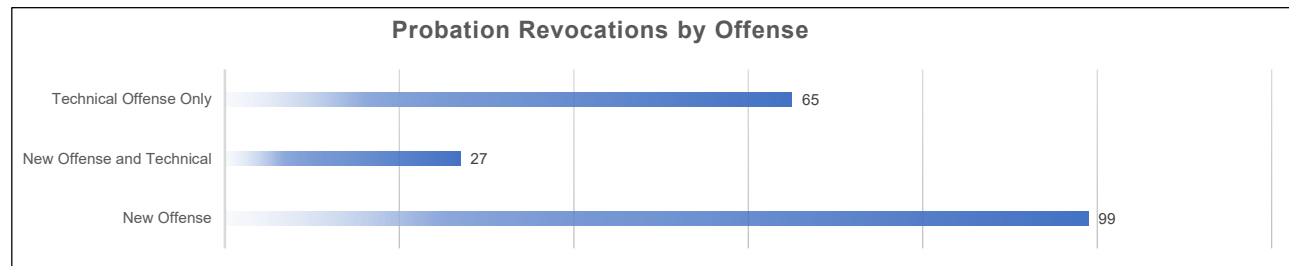

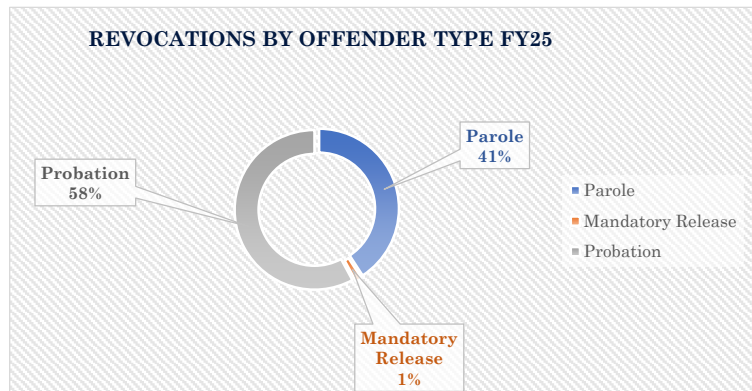

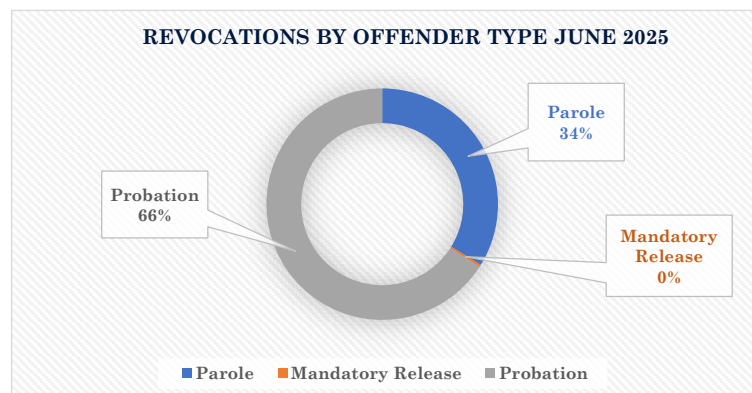
REVOCATIONS BY OFFENDER TYPE FY25

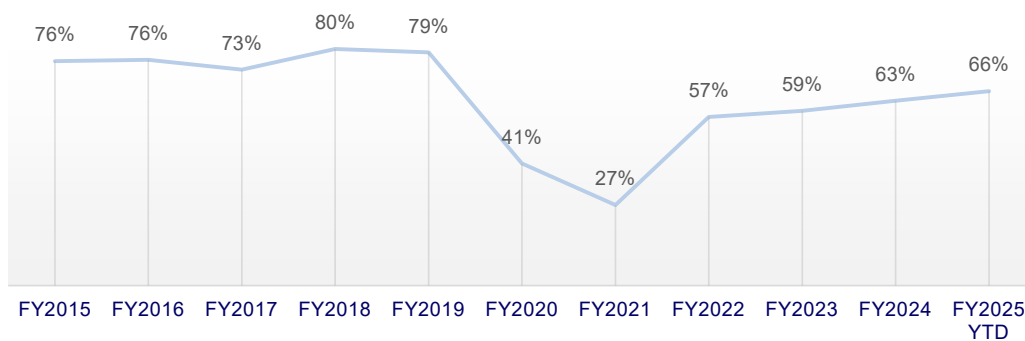

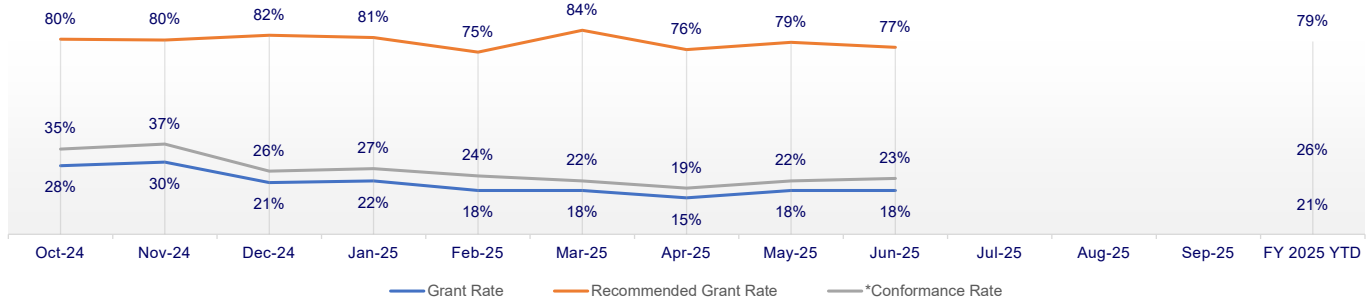

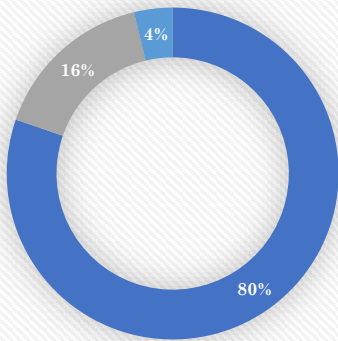

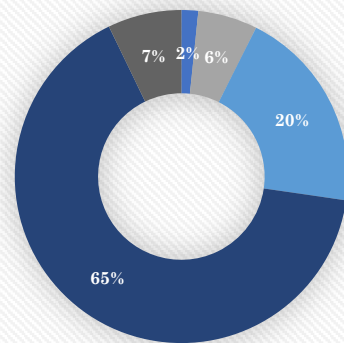
