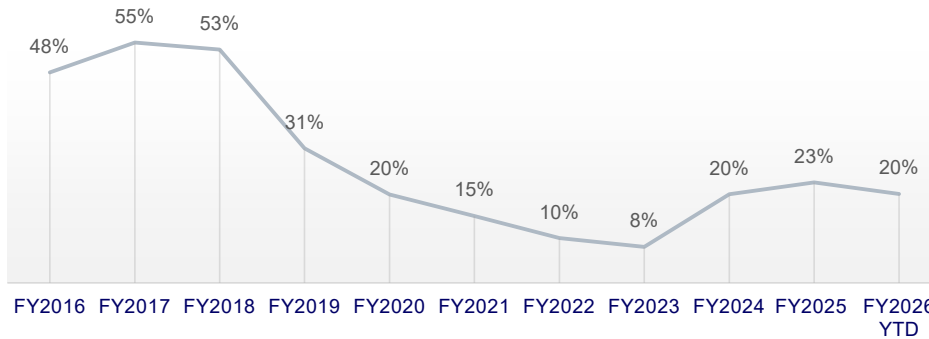

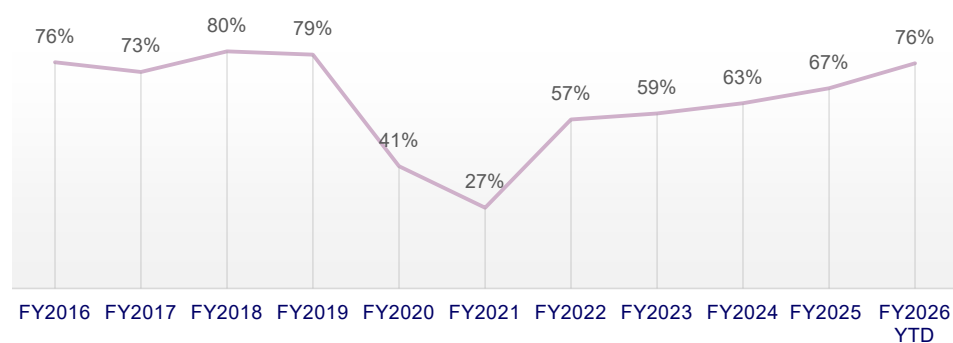

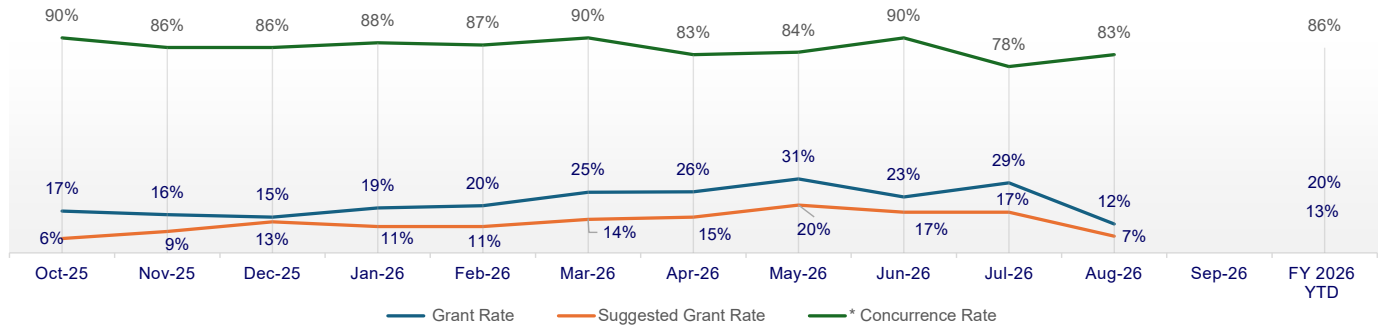
Board Action Yearly Trends-Pardons

Parole Decisions and Guideline Tracking by Month



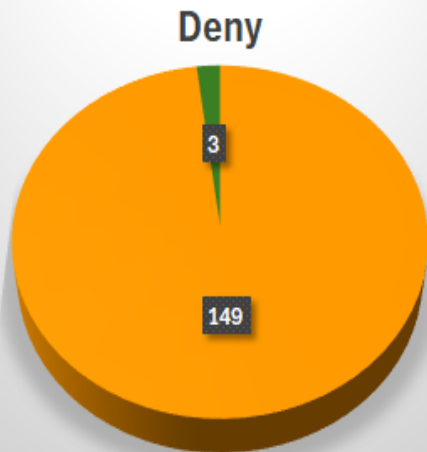

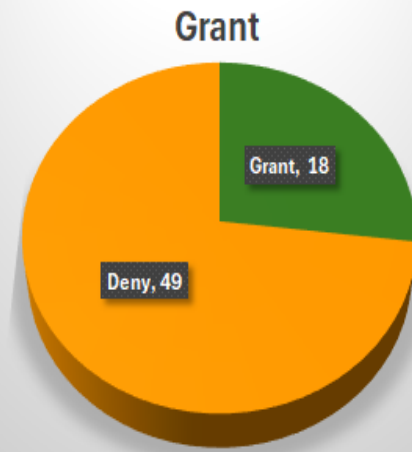

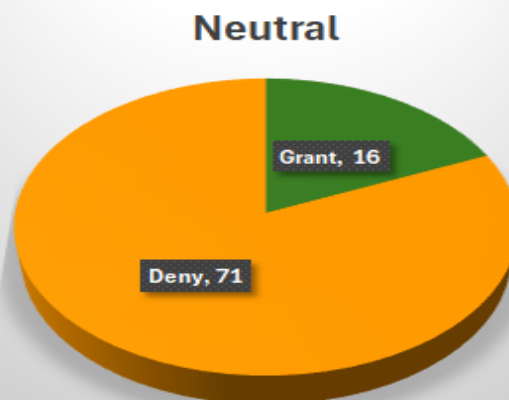

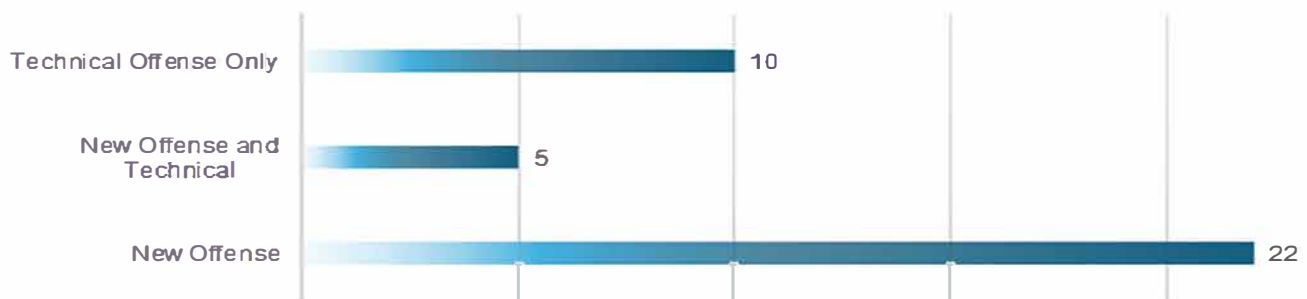

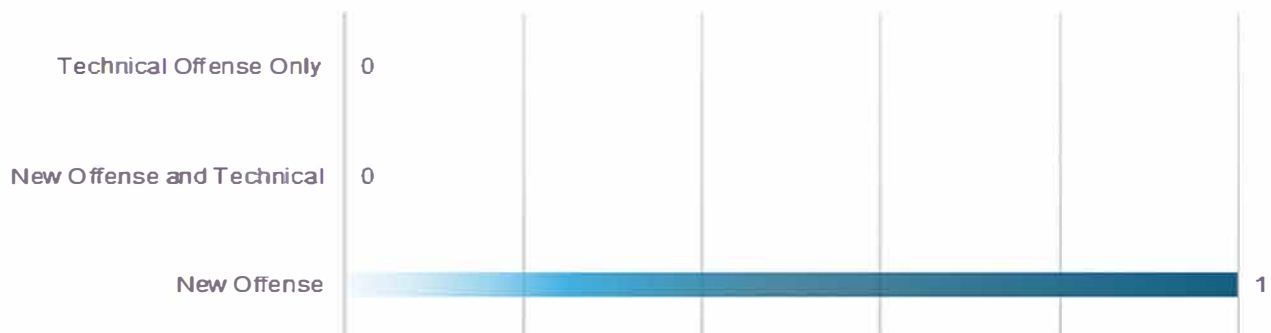
