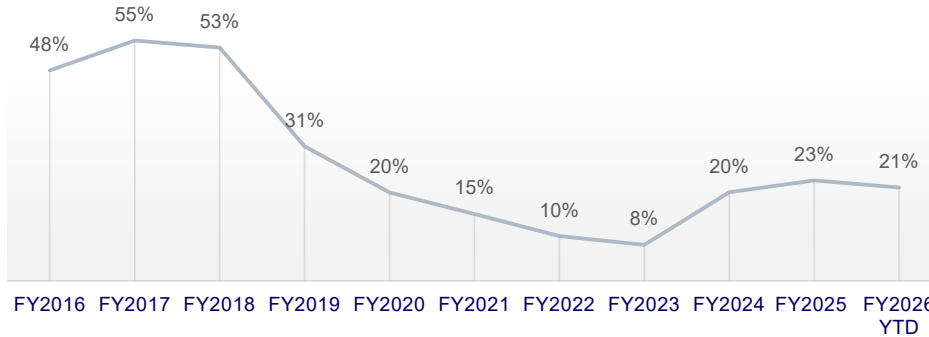

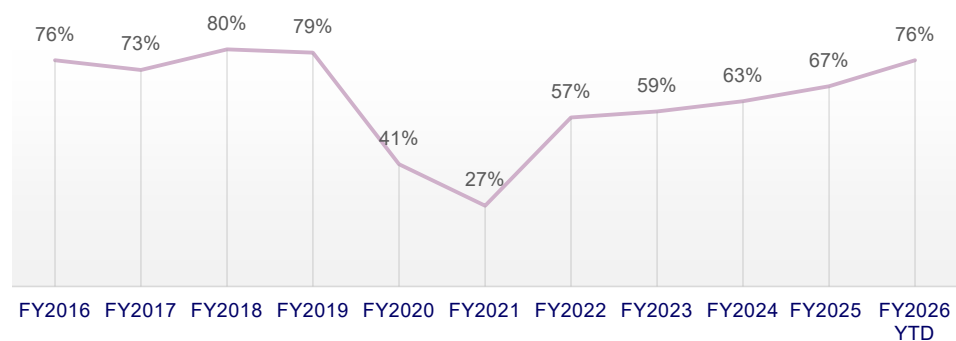

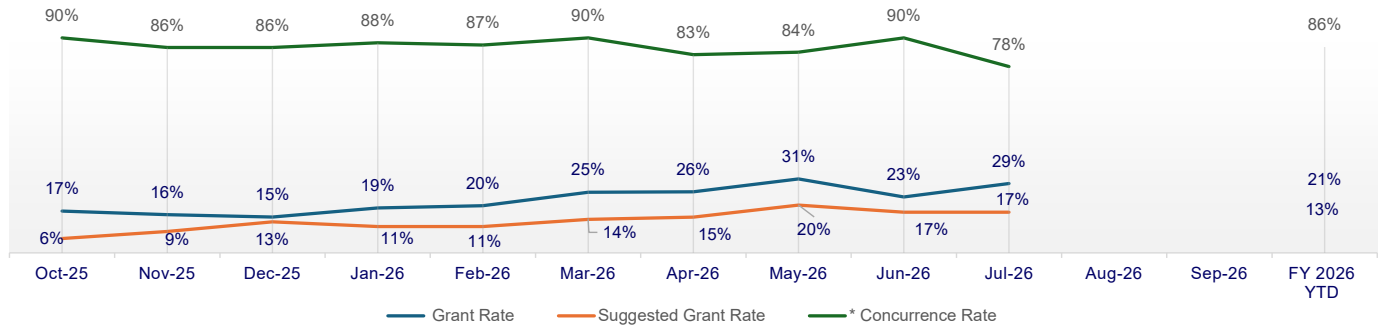

Parole Decisions and Guideline Tracking by Month



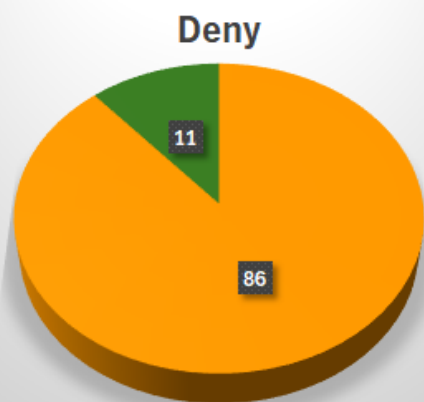

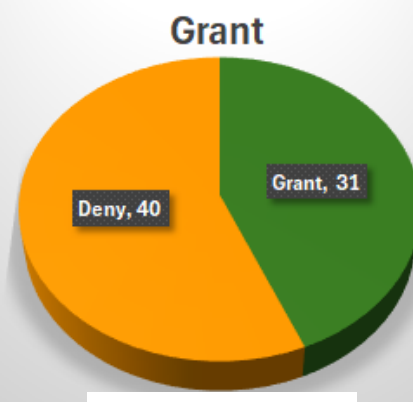

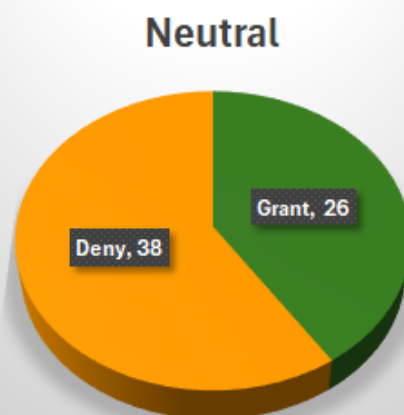

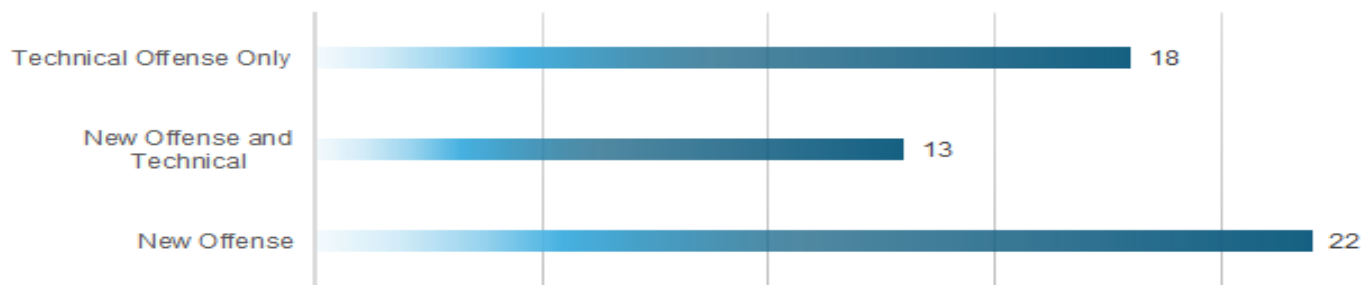

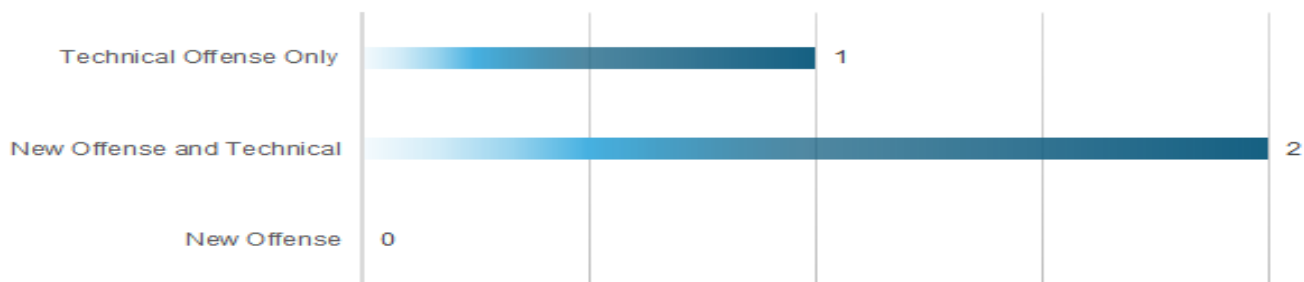
