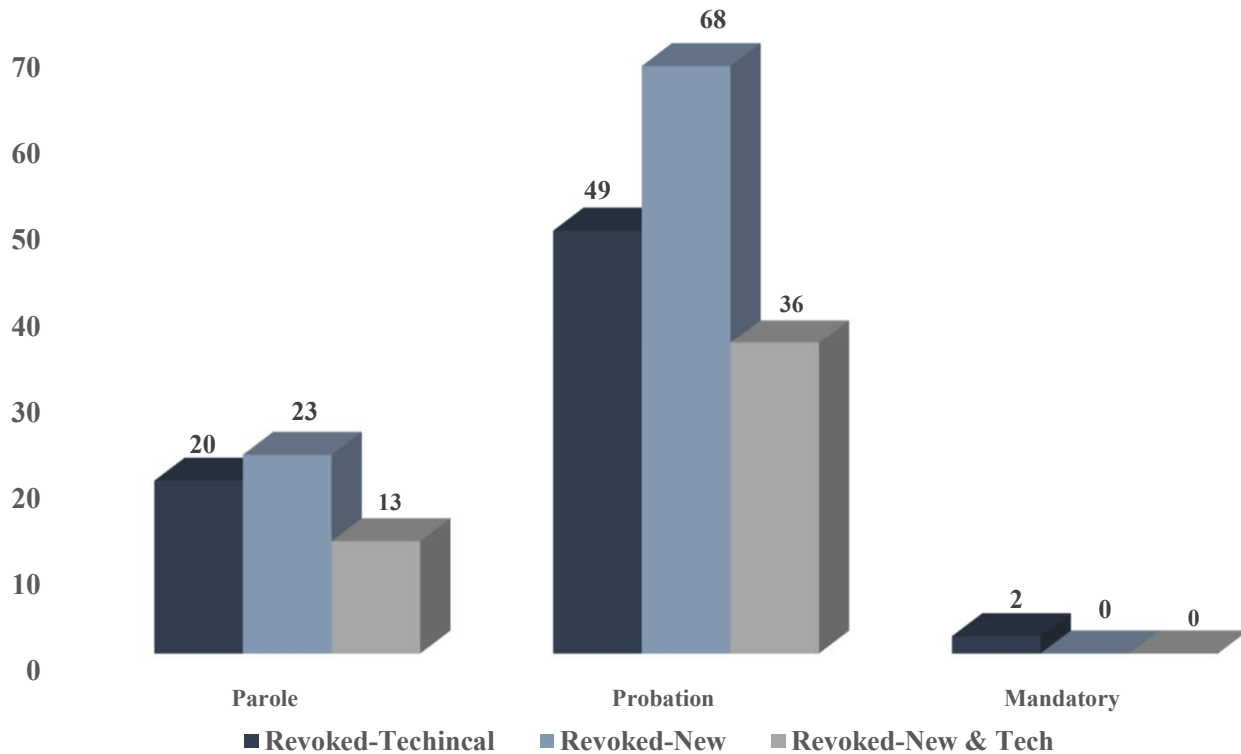

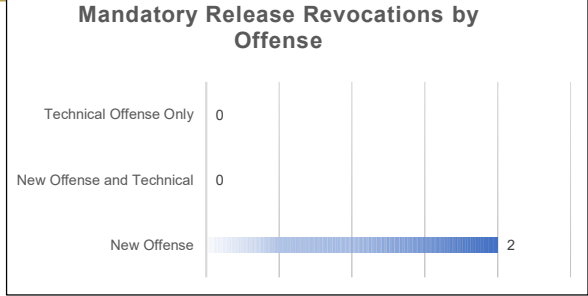
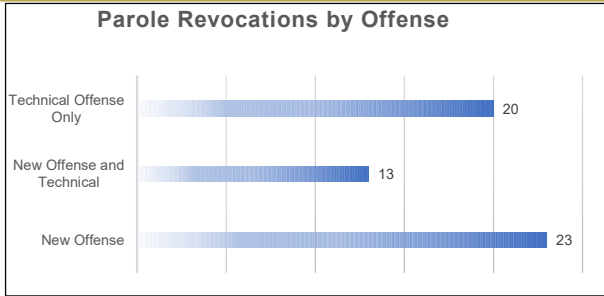

Revocations by Type



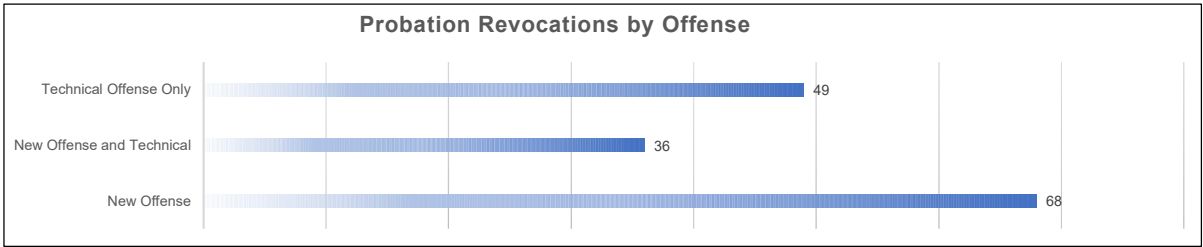

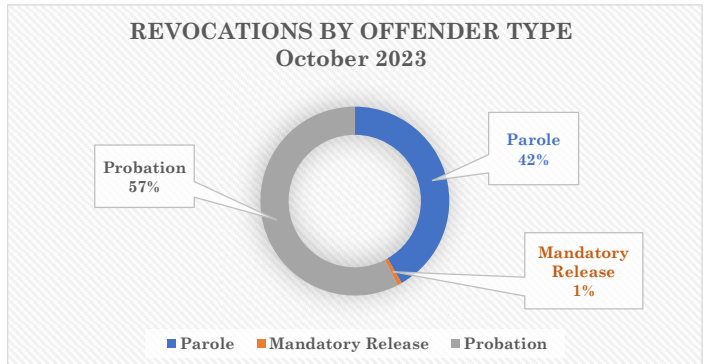

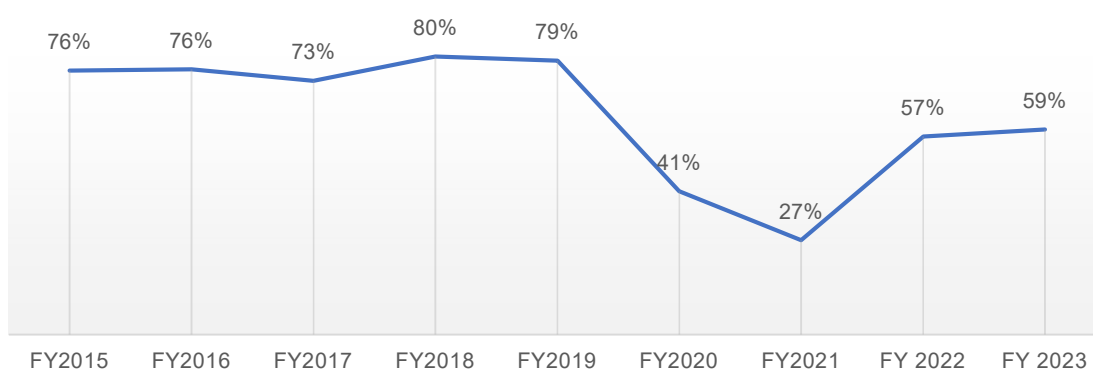
